

ARHG 107 Human Rights

This course covers human rights historical development, major human rights laws, treaties, and conventions. To learn obligations as citizens and residents of Bahrain as well as a member of the international community and to understand Human Rights Enforcement Mechanisms in Bahrain. (*Pre-requisites: None*)

Course Learning Outcomes:

By the end of the course, students will be able to:

1. Demonstrate a comprehensive understanding of what are Human Rights.
2. Explain the history of the declaration of human rights.
3. Relate basic human rights to daily life.
4. Use basic skills to classify human rights into the three basic divisions.
5. Use human rights information to arrive, with some guidance, at conclusions about the mechanisms of human rights implementation in Bahrain.
6. Operate in teams to discuss cases related to human rights in different contexts.
