

Math 154 Calculus II

This course involves applications and techniques of integration, including substitution, by parts, trigonometric substitution, and by partial fractions. The course also introduces improper integrals, numerical integration, sequences and series, geometric series formula, criteria for convergence, power series, and Taylor expansion.

(Pre-requisites: Math 151 or Math 153)

Course Learning Outcomes:

By the end of the course, students will be able to:

1. Apply the appropriate definite integrals in geometric context.
2. Apply the appropriate series/ sequence test to decide the convergence or divergence of series/ sequences.
3. Solve and interpret definite or improper integrals using a variety of integrating techniques.
4. Calculate and present results related to definite integrals and series using numerical approximations and software.
